- o The applicant has an overall cumulative grade point average of 2.8 or better (on a 4.0 scale).
- o The applicant has completed at least 30 semester hours or equivalent of college.
- The applicant is pursuing a degree in: GIS, Geospatial Information Science, Mapping Sciences, Geomatics, Imaging, Remote Sensing, Photogrammetry or related subjects.

All application materials must be received at the above address by December 1, 2001, in order to be considered. The winner will be notified by January 2, 2002.
